Traffic signs are federally regulated

U.S. traffic control standards, including those for signs, are published in the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD). In January of 2007 the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) amended the United States Code to make it clear that MUTCD standards apply to all roads, including private roads open for public travel. Included are private roads and parking lots for shopping malls and restaurants, office complexes, apartment and residential developments, sports and recreation facilities, and other similar businesses open to the public.

The MUTCD requires that all traffic signs be properly positioned, legible and in compliance with standards for:

- Size, shape and color
- · Sign placement and mounted height
- Design and legibility
- · Reflectivity level

Maximize public safety on your property

Use of uniform signs that are easily recognized by all drivers improves safety and traffic flow, helping to protect residents, employees, customers and other visitors on your property. Concern for public safety and use of standard traffic control contributes to a positive image of your property, and may help to minimize insurance costs and tort liability risk.


Get the most from your investment
